3. the one approved by the Department of Education and Science and I enclose a copy of one we used here which has been suitably amended to cover the Adderley Village Hall.
4. You see it is necessary to have 3 Trustees in the Conveyance and I suggest yourself and myself and one other (Mr. *Cope* ?).
5. It can be quite helpful to the Village Hall Management Committee if I agree to sell the property say for £100 to the Trustees. The cost of the purchase i.e. £100 would then be eligible for a grant of £50 from the Ministry if the scheme is approved. I would make a donation of £100 to the funds after the transaction had been completed.
6. I cannot too strongly emphasise that nothing must or can be done by way of improvements until the scheme has been approved by the Ministry and all work must have prior approval before it is started. Otherwise grants cannot be paid.


If you will let me know the outcome of your meeting I will take the matter further. Please return my draft Deed when you have perused it.

You will note that I have underlined and marginal lined several points which should be made very clear to the people attending the meeting.

Nothing in the Deed will prevent the Mens' Club continuing to use it but of course the Club will not have exclusive use of the Room. In other words the Management Committee could let the Hall for W.I., M.U. and Youth Club activities equally with the Mens' Club. On the other hand there is nothing to prevent the Mens' Club continuing to run its own bar.*

I hope this makes the matter clear but if it does not Mr. Whitehouse will do all he can to clarify it.
